
Upcoming Article Series: How To Be A Good Hound ...*Rockhound, that is!*




GEM TRAILS UP IDAHO & WESTERN MONTANA

Books of interest to the Montana Rockhound



Another classic from Lanny Ream is his <u>Gem Trails</u> of Idaho and Western Montana. Republished in 2012, it is available from a variety of sources. Lanny covers 99 different collecting localities – spread throughout our western neighbor, Idaho, and the western part of Montana. The republished edition was updated with GPS information and handy "at-a-glance" information as well as detailed maps. But, as always, double check current access requirements, fire conditions, and claim status before venturing out to collect.

43rd Annual Montana Crystal Collectors Rendezvous



September 27-29, 2024 Bozeman, Montana

Montana Crystal Collectors has been described as an event, rather than an organization. Once a year, a group of people get together to buy, sell, trade, and talk about rocks and minerals. This year the event will be held in Bozeman MT, September 27 – 29, at the Best Western GranTree Inn, just off the 7th avenue interchange (1325 N. 7th Avenue).

Friday evening is a social event where people that haven't seen each other for a year have a chance to just visit.

Saturday morning is a buy/sell opportunity. Anybody that wants to can set out rocks, minerals and jewelry for sale is welcome to. There are a limited number of tables (usually 10 to 15), and tables are first come first serve (sharing is allowed/encouraged). The group breaks for lunch at noon, which ends the "for sale" portion of the day, and all for sale items should be packed up at that point.

Saturday afternoon includes speakers on various rock, mineral, and geology related topics. This year the speakers will include Peter Bennett (Faceting) and Paul Senn (Factors affecting Crystal Growth) among others. There is a best self-collected specimen competition, where anybody can show off the coolest thing they found in the last year. All attendees get to vote on their favorite, and the winner gets to take possession of the "fickle finger of fate" award for a year. The award must be returned the following year, to be given to the next winner. The afternoon ends with a live auction. Most people who sell stuff during the morning donate an item for the auction. The auction is how we raise the money to pay for the facility that holds the event each year – there are no dues, or entrance fees. So people are encouraged to donate an item, and bid!

Saturday evening includes a banquet dinner, and another prominent speaker. This year, our speaker is Dr. Michael Wise, a geologist from the Smithsonian National Museum in Washington D.C. The banquet dinner is \$36 per person and includes Mesquite chicken, barbecue pulled pork, and other side dishes. If you want to go to the banquet, please contact me no later than September 16 for reservations. Also, if you do make a banquet reservation, but something comes up and you can't make it, please let me know to cancel. We still have to pay for any unclaimed dinners.

Sunday we have a field trip, the location of which usually isn't decided until the last minute, as it's often dependent on weather.
